

PRESIDENT: ROBERT T. SCHREIBER, MD

Dr. Robert Schreiber is a physician who specialized in Pulmonary and Critical Care Medicine Diseases, and practiced in Great Neck and Massapequa, New York.

Prior to his recent retirement in November 2023, Dr. Schreiber was the Director of the Pulmonary Division and the Director of the Surgical ICU at St. Francis Hospital in Roslyn, New York. He was a partner of Nassau Chest Physicians, PC from 1986 until 2021 and then joined Catholic Health. He formerly was on the professional staffs of North Shore University Hospital in Manhasset, NY, Long Island Jewish Hospital in New Hyde Park,

NY, and St. Joseph Hospital in Bethpage NY. He had an appointment as a Clinical Assistant Professor of Medicine at Hofstra University Medical School through December 2023.

After earning his undergraduate degree from Emory University in Biology, Dr. Schreiber received his medical degree at State University of New York-Downstate Medical Center College of Medicine. He completed his internal medicine residency at Baltimore City Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland, and his fellowship in pulmonary medicine at the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill, North Carolina.

Dr. Schreiber is board-certified by the American Board of Internal Medicine in Internal Medicine as well the subspecialties of pulmonary disease; he was formerly board-certified in Critical Care Medicine. He is a Fellow of the American College of Chest Physicians and is a member of the American Thoracic Society.

He currently is the president of the Nassau County Medical Society and serves on the board of directors of the Nassau Academy of Medicine. Dr. Schreiber's clinical interests included the management of asthma and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), and he has had extensive experience diagnosing and treating complications of lung cancer. As an intensivist, he treated critical illnesses including sepsis, respiratory failure, shock, heart disease, and COVID19.
