Dr. Michael Ziegelbaum has been in the clinical practice of general urology for over 30 years. In addition to his clinical obligations, he has maintained a strong presence in areas of education and teaching.

An example of this has been his work in Haiti where he provides care to the local population and trains the Haitian medical force. Including American urology residents in this project has been to the advantage of both the American and the Haitian groups involved.

At the local and regional levels, he has made it a priority to be in leadership roles where he can effect positive changes to the practice of medicine. As president of the medical staff society, he has introduced annual CME courses of interest to the entire staff and other medical providers.

His influence has in part resulted in the Committee of Global Health. This allows for the coordination of activities between residents, medical students, and attending staff in resource-poor areas abroad and here in the US.

During the summers, he has served as a mentor for pre-medical students from SUNY at Binghamton. He finds this to be especially rewarding. Shadowing him as well as interacting with others on the health care team is a significant influence for the students in understanding the joys and challenges of medical practice.
